












POTENTIAL REVISION TO SECTION 10.16.050

- Section 10.16.050
- No person who owns or has possession, custody or control of any vehicle shall park such vehicle upon any street or alley for more than a consecutive period of seventy-two (72) hours.
- A. Recreational vehicles or temporary recreational vehicles, travel trailers, mobile homes, and camper trailers may park on any street for a 72 hour period of time.
- B. No person shall park or stand or permit to park any recreational vehicles or temporary recreational vehicles, travel trailers, mobile homes, and camper trailers for more than a 72 hours within a consecutive seven day period.
- C. A vehicle shall be considered to be in violation of this section when it is parked or standing on a street or alley within one thousand feet of the same location after 72 hours.
