Our mission is to build confidence and strength through fitness for every BODY impacted by physical, cognitive, and mental health challenges, empowering individuals to lead more independent and vibrant lives.

Program Alignment with Mission

The Adapted Athlete Rawhide Night and integrated sports leagues directly support our mission by creating inclusive opportunities for youth with disabilities to engage in physical activities and community events. These programs foster confidence, physical fitness, and social connection. helping participants improve their independence and quality of life. By providing accessible, supportive environments for youth of all abilities, these programs embody our commitment to inclusivity, strength-building, and personal growth, making fitness achievable for everyone.

 Briefly describe your agency's previous experience and success in providing youth services specifically for Visalia youth.

Since opening in July 2021, The Adapted Athlete has successfully provided a range of inclusive programs for Visalia youth, including integrated fitness classes, private training, social outings, and adaptive sports leagues and clinics. Our community-centered events, such as the Holiday of Inclusion and Trunk or Treat, bring together families and foster a welcoming environment. Supported by a \$185,000 grant from CVRC that was completed in 2023, we launched our sports programs, reaching over 350 youth to date. These efforts have allowed us to build a strong foundation in adaptive youth services, empowering local youth to grow in confidence, strength, and social connection.

If your proposed program is designed to serve a specific population, please describe the population and how the proposed program addresses their unique needs (e.g., those involved in the juvenile justice system, gang involvement, teen pregnancy, individuals with disabilities, homeless youth, substance/alcohol abuse, or other population).

Our proposed programs, the Adapted Athlete Rawhide Night and integrated sports leagues, are specifically designed to serve youth with disabilities, including physical, cognitive, and mental health challenges. This population often faces limited access to inclusive sports and social activities, which can hinder their physical health, social development, and confidence. Our programs address these unique needs by creating accessible, supportive environments where youth of all abilities can participate alongside their peers. Through our sports leagues, participants experience the physical benefits of regular exercise, while also developing social skills and building friendships in an inclusive setting. The Adapted Athlete Rawhide Night provides an opportunity for these youth to engage in a community event, promoting visibility and a sense of belonging in public spaces. Both programs are tailored to reduce barriers and foster independence, confidence, and social connection for youth with disabilities.

Yes, the program will have sufficient resources to operate if the desired grant amount is only partially funded, although it may limit the program's reach and capacity. With partial funding, we would prioritize essential activities such as covering registration fees for a reduced number of youth in our sports leagues and securing necessary resources for the Adapted Athlete Rawhide Night event. However, fewer youth may receive financial assistance for registration fees, which could decrease overall participation.

A partially funded award may result in slightly lower program outcomes, with fewer youth served and a potentially reduced ability to expand our reach within the Visalia community. Nonetheless, we remain committed to delivering impactful, inclusive experiences and would seek additional funding sources to supplement the program if needed.

To date ALV has provided clothing for more than 10,000 deserving VUSD students. This year our budget for Operation School Bell is \$125,000.00. 8. The mission of the <u>Central Valley Legends</u> is to teach youth sports and support healthy and active lifestyles through positive youth engagement opportunities. The Central Valley Legends (CVL) accomplish this goal through the implementation of a youth basketball program serving 6th, 7th and 8th grade boys. The program is available to any youth in the Central Valley of California. Practices occur in Visalia and tournaments are in Hanford and Fresno. CVL's coaches focus on creating a positive enrichment environment while teaching technical athletic skills. The proposed activities are a natural extension of CVL's work and offer additional opportunities to provide enrichment activities for Visala youth interested in expanding their basketball and overall fitness skills.

8. Briefly describe your agency's previous experience and success in providing youth services specifically for Visalia youth.

CVL has been providing youth sports engagement opportunities since 2022. The Central Valley Legends just launched the third season of youth sports. In 2023-24, the Legends provided youth engagement opportunities for 33 youth in Tulare County. The proposed skills clinics provide the opportunity to support local youth beyond the regular CVL teams and to continue to develop local energy and support for youth basketball and positive opportunities for youth engagement.

The Central Valley Legends program is available to anyone interested in expanding their competitive skills with the game of basketball. The proposed skills clinics are an extension of that work and allow CVL to serve more youth in Visalia through three (3) basketball skills clinics. Registration will be free and made available to youth residing in Visalia.

It is extremely challenging to offer free skills clinics because there is a cost to rent the facility, obtain insurance, and pay trained and experienced coaches to facilitate the skills training. This funding would provide the opportunity to offer focused training for area youth interested in expanding their skills with the game of basketball and offers a positive engagement opportunity to keep youth engaged. 11. There have not been any budgetary problems in the last five (5) years. CVL has sufficient funding to run the travel program and are currently fundraising to add enrichment activities that all youth in Visalia can enjoy.

More recently, we have been asked to provide workshops on a weekly basis for Accelerated Charter High School.

In 2006, Neighborhood Church "adopted" Houston Elementary School. We have partnered with school staff and parents to make life better for kids through mentoring programs, community service projects, building a neighborhood park, and hosting fun family events. We asked parents what they wanted most for their kids and they said they wanted to help them go to college. We started Neighborhood Degree to help our former Houston School kids achieve that dream. We believe helping them get to and through a degree program will create better opportunities for them in life. In 2022, our 17-year partnership became its own public charity called Neighborhood Degree. Neighborhood Degree's mission is "Connecting neighbors to learn together and expand networks to end poverty."

8. Briefly describe your agency's previous experience and success in providing youth services specifically for Visalia youth.

We have 18 years of experience providing positive and enriching experiences for thousands of Houston students and families. Some of our programs include a youth soccer league for over 100 students, weekly 1-on-1 mentoring for 5th and 6th grade students, a student leadership club at Green Acres Middle School, monthly free family events, field trips for students and parents, a community service club for kids & parents (about 200 people), and partnering with kids and parents to fundraise and build a park in 2015. Annually, over 500 parents and community volunteers provide over 4,000 hours of service investing in our youth.

9. If your proposed program is designed to serve a specific population, please describe the population and how the proposed program addresses their unique needs (e.g., those involved in the juvenile justice system, gang involvement, teen pregnancy, individuals with disabilities, homeless youth, substance/alcohol abuse, or other population).

Our program is focused on former Houston School students, many of whom live below the federal poverty line, are English-learners, are the children of immigrants and are the first in their families to attend college. In addition, we have partnered with "YoungLives" to include teen parents and with "Champions" to include gang impacted youth as well.

There are countless resources available to help students from poverty enter college/technical school but not all students know about these resources or how to access them. Our program bridges that gap. Each student has a 1-on-1 mentor that walks them through the process of discovering their career interests, helps them apply for degree programs and financial aid, and then coaches them through the program until they complete their degree.

 As a new nonprofit in 2022, Neighborhood Degree has not incurred any debt or budget deficits.

In addition, the laptops equip our graduates with essential technology that directly supports their success in their degree programs.

The Visalia Rescue Mission houses and supports children, who with their mother are experiencing homelessness. While the children are safely housed in our care, we provide after-school support services to children, which include homework tutoring by staff and volunteers, supervised education and health enrichment activies, overseen by staff and volunteers. During their time here, children are served 3 meals per day, with healthful options made available. Our shelter services support children, ages infant to 13 years old. Our after school activities support children, ages 3-13. Our statistics for fiscal year 23-24 (Cotober - September) include 234 unduplicated children served with an average daily childhood population of 22 individuals.

The Visalia Rescue Mission exists to confront the life-controlling circumstances of homelssness, and addiction with Christ-inspired services, programs, and resource counseling to build hopeful futures.

The VRM women's and children's shelter has been serving children for 17 years and has consistently seen improved educational success with the stability and support provided in our program. Since we do not have long-term connection to all of our clients, statistical data cannot be considered accurate.

Because we serve homeless youth, our primary service is safety and stability during difficult family circumstances. A safe place to sleep, eat, study, play and learn is the starting point for educational successs. Additional support services address each child's unique developmental needs, indvidually.

We have had a cash flow deficit for fiscal year 23-24 due to exhausing post COVID payroll support funds accompanied by econmic downturns in our thrift stores and inattention to donor cultivation by previous leadership. New attention is being paid to all streams of support and our deficit has turned around. We expect to be completely cash positive by the end of fiscal year 24/25.

Funds from the grant will be used to create a teen parent focused lunch club parenting education program which is a non-religious activity. Included in this program will be community resource awareness, father-child activities, family gatherings, mentorship, and group support. Appropriately 25 students will be served in the Visalia Unified School District with ages ranging from 14 to 18 years of age. 4. Program Outcome: Adolescent parents feel isolated and tend to withdraw as the challenges with a new child can be overwhelming. The Lunch Club brings them together with leaders who offer resources, support, community and hope, focusing on their lives, education, and parenting

skills.

Young Life's mission statement: Introducing adolescents to Jesus Christ and help them grow in their faith.

Young Life's vision statement: Together, we are compelled to model the way of Jesus in the lives of young people, to develop as leaders, to inspire others and to go as a diverse community on mission – resulting in more adolescents known by name and for who they truly are, in more kids knowing Jesus and in young people knowing their Kingdom purpose.

YoungLives will seek to provide adult mentors for adolescent parents. Mentors will build trusting relationships with the young parents that they would feel known and supported. Volunteers will provide education and activities promoting healthy parenting and relationship skills. Every young parent will find confidence to fulfill their purpose as parent resulting in positive mental and emotional outcomes for both parent and child.

8. Briefly describe your agency's previous experience and success in providing youth services specifically for Visalia youth.

YoungLives Tulare County has been providing mentors for teenage mothers, and included the fathers of their children, since 1991. In that time, hundreds of young parents have developed lifelong friendships with their mentors. A survey completed by YoungLives mores indicated that

their involvement increased their desire for educational attainment and college aspirations, connection with a supportive community, a sense of hope, meaning, and purpose.

Anecdotal evidence in Tulare County has shown that young fathers who participate in gatherings with their leaders and peers, were more engaged with their children. These young fathers have remained in the lives of their children regardless of the relational status with the mother.

9. If your proposed program is designed to serve a specific population, please describe the population and how the proposed program addresses their unique needs (e.g., those involved in the juvenile justice system, gang involvement, teen pregnancy, individuals with disabilities, homeless youth, substance/alcohol abuse, or other population).

This program will serve teenage parents at two Visalia Unified high schools, with a greater focus on teen father involvement. Statistically, a high percentage come from under-resourced homes, are gang associated, or at-risk of gang involvement. Parenting education emphasizes to teen parents the impact of their choices on the success of their children. The desire to be good parents is almost universal which enables us to reach this demographic. Currently, there is limited access to parenting education and healthy adult mentorship for teenage parents. Education and developing strong social connections will foster healthy family relationships, reduce the potential for child abuse, and increase parental confidence.

10. If requesting seed funding to start a new program or activity, please describe the need or gap you propose to address and how the proposed program will meet this need/gap.

While the lunch club program is not a new program, this is a re-start with more focus on teen father involvement. A focused effort on recruiting male mentors specifically for the teenage fathers, providing family activities, and relationship building events is a new program for YoungLives. Currently, there are limited resources for teenage fathers in our community that are not court ordered. This is the gap we wish to fill. Engage and equip the fathers before problems arise.

Young Life/YoungLives Tulare County has not had any financial or budget deficits.
