PROGRAM NARRATIVE

1. **OBJECTIVES**

An Application for Federal Aviation Administration Airport Improvement Program funds has been prepared for the engineering design of the Reconstruction of Taxilane A (50' x 1,314') and Mark Taxiway E Connector with No Taxi Island, proposed to be included in the 2025 Airport Improvement Program at the Visalia Municipal Airport. This project is described as follows:

The existing Taxilane A pavements are old, have not had any maintenance since before 1999 and are exhibiting cracking, alligator cracking and moderate weathering. The PCI in 2012 was 72 but has since deteriorated and a new PCI calculation is currently in progress. It is important to reconstruct these pavements before failure occurs. The proposed reconstruction consists of pulverizing the existing AC and AB and reusing as 5" of ASB (FDR Recycled asphalt), 6 inches of AB, and 4 inches of AC.

New airfield markings will be installed.

Taxiway E markings will be revised to paint a no-taxi island to eliminate direct access from the apron to the runway.

2. **RESULTS OR BENEFITS EXPECTED**

The reconstruction of the taxilane pavements will provide safe and functional taxilane pavements for operations at the airport, which will have a remaining life so far as deep-seated distress is concerned of 20+ years.

3. **APPROACH**

a. <u>Plan of Action</u> - All airport design conforms to Advisory Circular 150/5300-13B, Airport Design. Specifications are being prepared based on Advisory Circular 150/5370-10H, Standards for Specifying Construction of Airports. All safety requirements as outlined in Advisory Circular 150/5370-2G, Operational Safety on Airports During Construction will be included in the Construction Safety and Phasing Plan prepared for this project.

The engineering will be performed in two phases as follows:

Phase 1 - Preliminary Engineering

- a. Prepare Environmental Document Cat Ex.
- b. Topographic Surveys.

c. Geotechnical Studies

Phase 2 - Engineering Design and Preparation of Plans and Specifications

- a. Perform complete engineering design.
- b. Prepare complete plans and specifications for this project, ready for bid.
- c. Prepare Engineer's Report including engineer's estimate of construction costs for the proposed project, the Construction Safety and Phasing Plan, and the Construction Management Plan.
- b. <u>Consultant</u> The consultant who will work on the project will be Brandley Engineering. Brandley Engineering will perform the engineering design for this project.

4. **GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION**

This project included in this project Application will be at the Visalia Municipal Airport located in Visalia, Tulare County, California. The areas to be served will be the City of Visalia and areas of Tulare County that will be served by the airport improvements.

The location and dimensions of the project are shown on the project sketch included as part of this Program Narrative.



Dear Mr. Franklin:

The City of Visalia proposes the engineering design of the Reconstruction of Taxilane A and Mark Taxiway E Connector with No Taxi Island at Visalia Municipal Airport, Visalia, Tulare County, California, under the 2025 Airport Improvement Program (AIP) of the Federal Aviation Administration. It is proposed to utilize the services of Brandley Engineering to provide engineering services for the design of this project. The City of Visalia and Brandley Engineering entered into negotiations for the engineering fees related to this project.

The consulting firm of Brandley Engineering was selected from those consultants who submitted their qualifications, and the City of Visalia entered into an agreement with Brandley Engineering.

An independent fee estimate (IFE) for the engineering design for the subject project was prepared by Mike Porter, City Civil Engineer, for services to be provided including environmental studies (Cat Ex), topographic surveys, geotechnical studies, and engineering design and preparation of plans and specifications ready for bid. A copy of this IFE is attached.

A scope of work and fee proposal for the Engineering Design Services for the reconstruction of the Taxilane A and marking of the Taxiway E Connector with No Taxi Island has been requested from Brandley Engineering. The consultant has submitted their fee proposal for the Engineering Design Services in the amount of \$136,600.

The Sponsor's Independent Fee Estimate was \$122,961, which is 10% under the consultant's fee proposal. Since the IFE is within 10% of the consultant's fee proposal, the Sponsor considers this reasonable and recommends accepting the consultant's fee of \$136,600.

The Sponsor's independent fee estimate is attached to this record of negotiation and hereby submitted to the ADO for a reasonableness of cost determination.

The analysis was conducted in good faith to ensure the fees are fair and reasonable. The procedures outlined in AC 150/5100-14 have been followed.






