- Protecting local government funding and programs, even though the estimated deficit for the budget is only \$2B, there is concern this number will grow.
- Engaging on behalf of the City on legislation addressing the "affordability crisis" in California.
- Continuing to pursue funding and policies to address water supply and SGMA implementation.
- Pushing back on continued legislation that promotes housing development at the expense of local control.
- Supporting and promoting policies that benefit the Industrial Park and increase job opportunities in the state.
- Engaging on legislation that assist local government in addressing local homelessness, housing and zero-emission fleet vehicles.
- Any other issues as directed by Council and city staff.
