2021 Legislative Summary

- 2,203 bills introduced in 2021
 - 1,527 Assembly Bills
 - 676 Senate Bills
- 836 bills sent to Governor's desk (38%)
- Total Bills Signed into Law: 770 (92%)
- Total Bills Vetoed: 66 (7.9%)



2021 Legislative Efforts

- 146 bills tracked for the City of Visalia
- 59 bills watched
 - 25 died in the legislature
- Subject Matter
 - Housing
 - Homelessness
 - Economy
 - COVID-19



Bills with Positions

- SB 9 (Housing Development) Oppose unless Amended/Neutral - Signed
- SB 106 (Mental Health Services) Watch Held in Legislature
- SB 387 (Pupil Health) Support Held in Legislature
- AB 377 (Water Quality) Oppose Held in Legislature
- AB 1434 (Indoor water use) Oppose Held in Legislature

- Industrial Park/Energy Needs

Redistricting

- City of Visalia split across two districts
- Senate
 - SD 12 Shannon Grove
 - SD 16 Open (Hurtado, Parra)
- Assembly
 - AD 32 Vince Fong
 - AD 33 Devon Mathis

State Budget

- \$286 billion spending plan
 \$45.7 billion surplus (likely more)
- Visalia Budget Requests
 - Eastside Regional Park Groundwater Recharge Basin F Construction - \$6.5 million
 - Central Visalia Traffic Safety Action Plan
 Implementation Funding for Sidewalk and Bikeway
 Improvements \$3 million
 - Aerial Fire Truck: \$1.6 million
 - National Fitness Campaign Outdoor Fitness Court: \$250,000

Gas Tax Debate

- Part 1 January Budget Proposal
 - Newsom proposes freezing gas tax increase (\$0.511 increase per gallon)
 - Legislators and other groups push back
- Part 2 State of the State
 - Pivot from tax freeze to rebate
 - Republican proposals to freeze and backfill defeated
- Party 3 Moderate Dems
 - Propose \$400 rebate for every California taxpayer (even if don't own or drive a car)
 - Estimated at \$9 billion
- Part 4 Dem Leadership
 - \$200 payments to taxpayers and dependents in households earning less than \$250,000
- Part 5 Governor's Newest Proposal
 - \$400 rebate per car (limit two per person, paid via debit card)
 - \$750 million in grants to encourage public transit agencies to offer Californians three months of free rides.
 - \$600 million to pause part of the diesel sales tax for one year.
 - \$523 million to suspend July's scheduled increase to California's gas and diesel excise tax
 - Estimated at \$11 billion



2022 Introduced Legislation

- 2,020 bills introduced for this 2022 Session
 - 1,461 bills introduced during the last week alone.
 - 1,361 Assembly Bills
 - 659 Senate Bills
- Visalia tracking
 - 284 bills total
 - 48 carryover bills (from 2021)
 - 236 new bills



Legislative Review Process

- 284 bills separated by subject matter
 - Community Development
 - Economic Development
 - Environmental Quality
 - Finance
 - Homelessness
 - Housing
 - Local Control
 - Public Safety
 - Public Works/Transportation
 - Quality of Life
- Review by City Department Heads
- Positions based on Dept Head review and consistent with approved City Platform



2022 Legislative Platform

- Purpose is to provide guidance to city staff and NM to allow more nimble response as bills move through the legislative process.
- Minor updates to previously approved platform
