

- Grant funding through proposition 68 California state parks statewide park development and community revitalization program

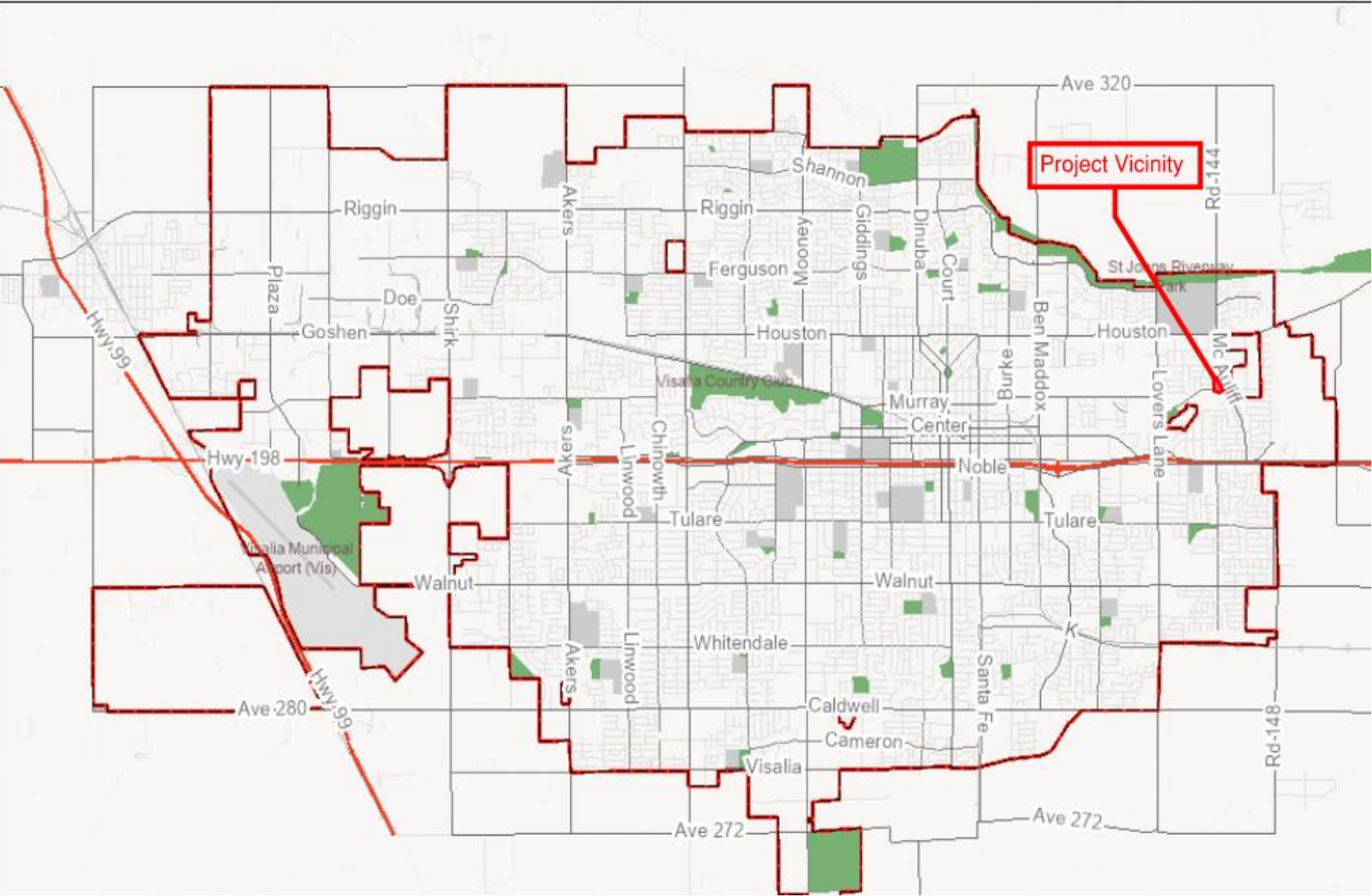

An inclusive park goes beyond accessibility opportunities and welcomes all users through diverse design and equipment

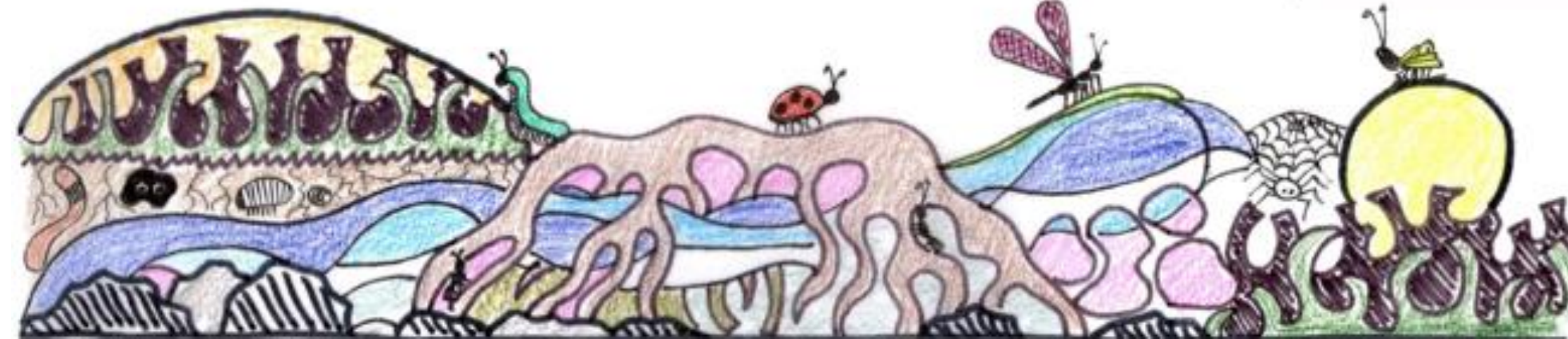
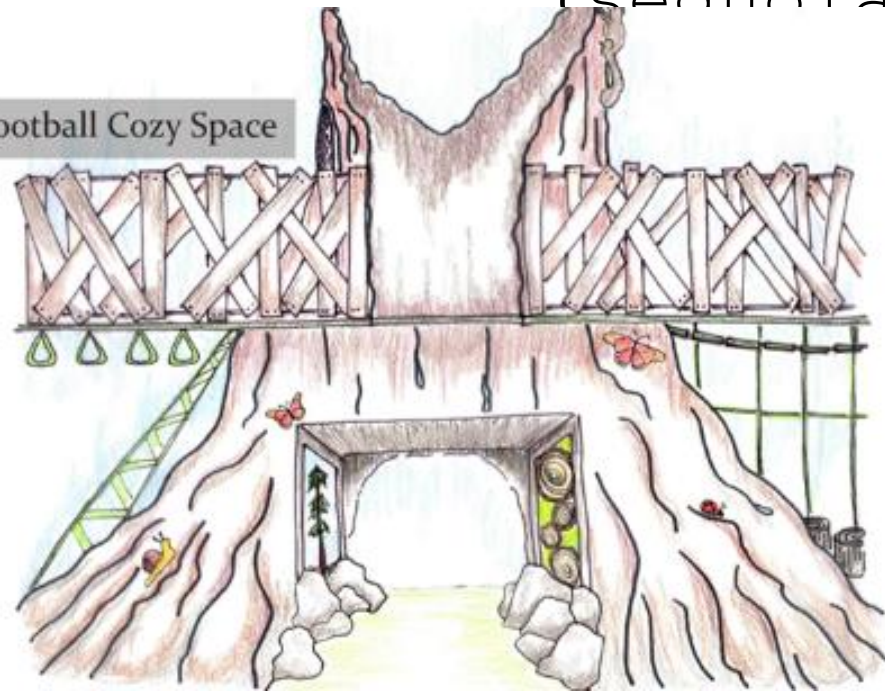
Inclusive features target: auditory, spatial and balance, visual, cognitive, and tactile (touch)

Comments
